IN PARLIAMENT THIS MONTH

Welcome to our first monthly newsletter! I'm delighted to be able to represent you as your MP and have been working hard to do just that, both in Westminster and Worthing West.

In Parliament, as a member of the Health & Social Care Select Committee, health has been a key theme. I spoke in the House on the issue of obesity and the inequalities which lead to it, such as the high price of healthy food when compared to processed food of far less nutritional value.

I also joined the Committee's discussions on adult social care reform, as well as All Party Parliamentary Groups on Antimicrobial Resistance (AMR) and Liver Health. Resistance to drugs such as antibiotics is a serious problem both in the UK and worldwide. While as part of Love Your Liver Day I volunteered for a liver Fibroscan – and thankfully received a clean bill of health!

I hosted the launch of the Food Foundation report 'The Broken Plate 2025' once again advocating for equitable food systems, attended the Gambling with Lives Annual Parliamentary Forum, highlighting gambling-related harms and joined over thirty MP's holding property management company Firstport to account, a national scandal also affecting long-suffering residents here in Worthing West.

I was also appointed to the Tobacco and Vapes Bill Committee. Throughout January, we have gone through each clause of the Bill, debating areas of contention and seeking clarity in others. This Bill will mean our children and grandchildren can grow up as smokefree generations, with significant reductions of smoking related disease such as lung cancer and heart attacks and no advertising or sales of vapes to children.

HEALTH MATTERS

Health is also a key part of my constituency work and as part of the Government's national 10 year Health Plan, I've launched a constituency-wide consultation on NHS services. I'll be hosting events with residents, health partners and professionals, beginning in Angmering on February 7th.

Please look out for details and whether you're able to come along or not, let me know your thoughts. Residents have expressed their frustration about the time it takes to get through to GP surgeries on the phone, and I visited Angmering Medical Centre to discuss their telephone triage system, which they are in the process of improving.

Social Care is another area under immense pressure and I met with Caremark, a national home care provider based here in Worthing West. I'll be taking the issues both have raised back to Parliament.

Stagecoach are consulting on proposed changes to bus timetables and services. Please participate in the consultation.

Transport is always a hot topic and I've been out and about in Durrington and East Preston hearing your views.

Potholes are a perennial problem but at last Government is investing an extra £1.6 billion this year to start tackling the appalling state of our roads which means an extra 7 million potholes a year are set to be filled – great news for drivers and all road users.

Bus routes and timetables are changing in West Worthing. I am following up on this with local stakeholders, so please continue to share your thoughts and concerns with me.

GETTING THE BEST FOR OUR CHILDREN

Labour's Children's Wellbeing and Schools Bill is currently passing through Parliament, which will reset safeguarding and welfare standards for our children, with measures such as providing free breakfast clubs, limiting school uniform costs, giving extra support for SEND students and for those in care.

With this in mind, I've been meeting up with staff and pupils from Worthing schools and colleges, all serving different educational sectors but with the same determination to achieve the best possible outcomes for their students.

Oak Grove College and Durrington High School differ in scale but both run excellent teacher training programs, with Oak Grove staff sharing SEND teaching expertise with local mainstream schools.

I also welcomed an inspiring group of Worthing College students to Parliament and gave a talk there on how laws are made.
